



# FINANCIAL AID NOTES for Advanced Standing Students

## **Don't forget to complete the FAFSA!**

All students applying for summer aid for 2009 must submit the 2008-2009 FAFSA to the federal processing agency. The priority deadline was April 1st, but you may still apply if you have not done so already. The 2009-2010 FAFSA cannot be used for the 2009 summer term aid. If you want to be granted any kind of financial assistance for the 2009-2010 academic year, completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is very important whether or not you want loans. The form is online at <http://www.fafsa.ed.gov>. The priority deadline is March 15, but you can still complete it after that date. By completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at [www.fafsa.gov](http://www.fafsa.gov) you can be considered for loans by the University's Office of Scholarships and Student Aid (OSSA). ## **Student Jobs**

In late August we begin posting descriptions for student jobs on our website. Any MSW student may view the descriptions and apply for any grant-funded positions that are posted. Typically, positions are 6-8 hours/week and pay \$12-\$13 per hour.

Students with Merit awards, Full Tuition Remissions, and Federal Work Study awards **MUST** choose a Research Assistant position (**preferably state-funded**) that requires at least 12-15 hours/week.
