



FINANCIAL AID NOTES for Full-time Students

Don't forget to complete the FAFSA!

If you want to be granted any kind of financial assistance, completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is very important whether or not you want loans. The form is online at <http://www.fafsa.ed.gov>. The priority deadline is March 15, but you can still complete it after that date. By completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at www.fafsa.gov you can be considered for loans by the University's Office of Scholarships and Student Aid (OSSA). Student Jobs

In August we begin posting descriptions for student jobs on our website. Any MSW student may view the descriptions and apply for any grant-funded positions that are posted. Typically, positions are 6-8 hours/week and pay \$12-\$13 per hour.

Students with Merit awards, Full Tuition Remissions, and Federal Work Study awards **MUST** choose a Research Assistant position (preferably state-funded) that requires at least 12-15 hours/week.

Students with Dean's Research Awards **MUST** choose a Research Assistant position (preferably state-funded) that requires at least 5 hours/week. Please contact Student Services Assistant Jane Gump at jgump@email.unc.edu for more information.
