**If you would like to live on campus beginning in the fall semester**, you have two options:

**Odum Village Apartments** offer furnished bedrooms in a two-bedroom apartment which you share with a fellow graduate student. To apply, visit <http://housing.unc.edu> and select [New Graduate Student Application](#). **Applications for Odum Village** are processed on a first-come, first-served basis and space is limited. The official opening date for new graduate students to move on campus is Tuesday, August 4, 2009 after 9:00 am. If you would like to move in earlier during the summer, please apply as soon as possible, and then contract the housing office to arrange an earlier move-in date.

**Baity Hill at Mason Farm** offers new, unfurnished on-campus apartments primarily to students with families. Contact Baity Hill, if flexibility is required to move in earlier. There is no application deadline - apartments are leased on a first-come, first-served basis. For more information and to apply, call the Baity Hill at Mason Farm office at (919) 843-8831.
