



Housing for Advanced Standing Students

Graduate students have two options if they wish to live on campus: Odum Village and Baity Hill apartments.

Odum Village Apartments offer furnished bedrooms in a two bedroom apartment which you would share with a fellow graduate student. For summer residency at Odum Village, you will need to apply online for a space, then, contact the housing office regarding a “summer extension” to move in during the summer.

To apply, visit <http://housing.unc.edu> and select [New Graduate Student Application](#). For more information about Odum Village and the application process, click on “Get a Room.” **If you have problems with the online application**, call Housing and Residential Education at 919-962-5406 or 1-800-862-5502, or email housing@unc.edu. There is no application deadline. Rooms are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis. The official opening date for new graduate students to move on campus for the fall semester is Tuesday, August 4, 2009 after 9:00 am. If you would like to move in earlier during the summer, please apply as soon as possible, and then contact the housing office to arrange an earlier move-in date.

Baity Hill at Mason Farm offers new, unfurnished on-campus apartments primarily to students with families. July 1 is the typical beginning of a summer lease. Contact the Baity Hill office if flexibility is required to move in earlier. Apartments are leased on a first-come, first-served basis.
