Two Tenure Track Faculty Positions

The School of Social Work at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill invites nominations and applications for two tenure-track positions at the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor. The positions will start July 1, 2010. Candidates will join a community of active scholars and should have the ability to obtain external funding to support their research; publish their research findings; infuse their classroom teaching with knowledge based on the latest and strongest evidence; and provide service to the State of North Carolina, the nation, and international settings. We seek applicants with a demonstrated capacity to conduct rigorous research focused on informing, designing, developing, and evaluating social interventions that strengthen individuals, families and communities in the areas of direct practice, community practice, management, and policy. We hope to hear from applicants with expertise related to a broad array of diverse populations.

Applicants must possess a doctoral degree in social work or a related field or be at an advanced stage of completing a doctoral dissertation. Further, the successful applicant is expected to have a strong commitment to the M.S.W. and Ph.D. curricula and to classroom teaching. Preference will be given to applicants with a master's degree from a CSWE accredited social work program and a minimum of two years of post-masters social work practice experience. Salary is competitive and will be commensurate with experience. Candidates should electronically submit a curriculum vita, a letter outlining teaching and research interests, a current writing sample, and the names of four persons who can provide professional references online to: jobs.unc.edu/1002062.
