**GARY L. BOWEN, Ph.D., ACSW**

Dr. Bowen is Kenan Distinguished Professor in the School of Social Work at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He also holds a joint appointment in the Department of Communication Studies at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, and is a Spencer Program Faculty Member, Spencer Foundation Education Policy Research Training Program, at Duke University.

His honors include the National Graduate Student of the Year Award in 1981 from the National Council of Family Relations and an Alumni Pacesetter Award in 1998 from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro's School of Environmental Sciences "for actively making a difference in the lives of others and the world around them." In 2001, he was identified as a National Council on Family Relations Fellow for his enduring contributions to the field of family studies through a career of teaching, scholarship, outreach, professional service and leadership; in 1983, he was identified as a Fellow, Armed Forces and Society. Dr. Bowen received the "Most Innovative Professor Award" in 2002 from the Social Work Student Organization at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill; in 2005 and 2006, he received the Dean's Recognition of Teaching Excellence, which recognizes faculty members whose student teaching evaluation scores consistently remain among the highest of the faculty. Dr. Bowen serves as a member of the distinguished Research Council for America's Promise.
