He currently serves as the Program Coordinator for UNC Family Medicine's Formerly Incarcerated Transition (FIT) Program, a program that connects returning citizens with chronic health conditions to local Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) and a Community Health Worker who also has a history of incarceration. Juan's work includes supervising the program's Community Health Worker, serving as the liaison for the program in meetings with key partners like the North Carolina Department of Public Safety (NCDPS), SAMSHA, and other. He created this training to support the providers at their partner FQHCs in their work with FIT clients and anyone else serving minoritized people and those with a history of incarceration.
