Levine works closely with MSW students who are interested in exploring the field of child welfare, including child maltreatment prevention, evidence-based interventions, and systemic challenges. She serves as the coordinator and faculty advisor for students in the North Carolina Child Welfare Education Collaborative (CWEC), a statewide workforce development initiative that prepares students for careers in child welfare agencies across North Carolina. In the CWEC coordinator role, Levine provides specialized training to MSW students as they enter their child welfare field practicum, serves as the field faculty and academic advisor for students while in the MSW program, and teaches an advanced elective course on child welfare practice. Students graduating from the CWEC program go on to social work careers that directly support the needs of children and families and make lasting impacts in the field of child welfare policy, practice, and administration.

Levine serves as a faculty advisor for this interdisciplinary group of students, faculty, and practitioners that promote topics related to child maltreatment research, policy, and practice.
