Call for Collaborations

Solving challenges by advancing meaningful, equal, and impactful community partnerships



Value Proposition

- ➤ What if those experiencing the conditions that need addressing were the ones to define the problems and the solutions?
- ➤ What if university teams engaged communities in an equal, highly respectful, collaborative manner where the community members are the experts, and knowledge sharing is a two-way street?
- ➤ What if, instead of staying a short time simply to collect data, the SSW created prolonged relationships with the community via impact/learning hubs?

General Description

- ➤ Call for Collaborations (C4Cs) are funded projects sponsored by the SSW and designed to support meaningful partnerships between the community and our School.
- Project ideas will derive from community partners
- ➤ Projects will comprise transdisciplinary and collaborative teams representing the School, community groups, organizations, and agencies.
- ➤ Broadly speaking, C4C projects are designed to fund pilot projects carried out by North Carolina-based organizations and groups that focus on helping children, families, and communities.

Purpose

Project ideas must fall within one or more of the following most salient areas of impact:

- community and organizational resilience and capacity-building
- > children, youth, and family well-being and development
- > system and economic transformations
- > solution-driven approaches that anticipate future challenges and provide prevention and support for those populations considered to be most vulnerable or at risk

Objectives of the C4C Awards

- > Support community organizations so that they can conduct an accurate and precise analysis of a need or social problem
- > Develop teams comprising faculty, volunteers, students, public and private sector, and community practitioners to propose solutions
- ➤ Enable teams to benefit from a two-year planning period to develop a strategy to leverage additional research and federal funding, bringing resources to North Carolina to tackle the identified conditions
- > The School will pair community agencies/organizations with faculty, staff, and students who will provide technical assistance and commitment to sustained partnerships
- > The idea is to get the community group or organization started by empirically supporting their ideas so that they can leverage their results into larger, federally funded efforts
